	<p>Should online courses be offered primarily in the summer with entry into Level II in the fall only for LPN students? Will CNM teach the course? Who will teach the classes in the summer? I agree with Jenny, LPNs entering into Level 1 does not appear to be a mobility option.</p> <p>CNM – Currently LPNs are taking the intro to concepts class. Still waiting for implementation of “Concepts for Transition Students.” Would consider teaching online Introduction to Concepts and Evidence-Based Practice courses online through SUN online. Could make the online courses available each semester based on need. No requirement for number of hours worked prior to LPN admission. LPN students must enter into Level I.</p> <p>NMSU – Teaching evidence based course f2f in the summer. Agree with Tracy, add skills check list. Is there a requirement for number of hours worked prior to LPN admission. The highest level that LPNs can enter into is Level I.</p> <p>SFCC - Why wouldn't students just take the regular Intro to Concepts course? Could teach intro to concepts and evidence based practice through sun online. Any school can offer it. Having students enter in Level I does not look like a mobility option. It looks like LPNs must start in Level I.</p> <p>Dona Ana – Using HESI PN Mobility Exam with cutoff score of 650 . Add a skills check off to test for credit for Principles of Nursing Course. CNA skills are not the issue.</p> <p>UNMG, CNM, NMSU, and SFCC all noted that LPNs must enter into Level I – it cannot be bypassed for entry into Level II.</p>	<p>changes/recommendations. Skills checklist will be provided at next meeting. Need to find out about ATI equivalent of HESI PN Mobility Test. Diane and Misty will reach out to ATI.</p>
