	<p>*Meets the pre-requisite criteria, including the PN admission exam as determined by each individual school</p> <p>*Satisfactory demonstration of skills including medication administration, dosage calculation, medical asepsis and one random nursing level skill from the Level I skills list.</p> <p>*Upon admission and satisfactory demonstration of skills, the LPN student will receive credit for the Principles of Nursing Practice Course.</p>	
<p>NCLEX-PN NMNEC eligibility</p>	<p>All schools represented agreed to leave the eligibility to the determination of the NMBON on a case-by-case basis.</p>	
<p>LPN NMNEC curriculum</p>	<p>UNMG – Looking at the development of a high-school level LPN program. Initial draft included content from out-of-state conceptual LPN programs utilizing the APS schedule. Need to add summer semester. Will continue to develop.</p> <p>CEC – Connie noted that LPN high school students have several restrictions: no evening clinicals, most of clinical hours are completed during the summer session, use of online courses such as nutrition, G&D, and EBP may be useful. Connie is interested in a curriculum that allows for entry into 3rd semester. Jenny from SFCC had expressed a similar interest for high school LPN students.</p> <p>NMJC – Misty is interested in an LPN to ADN program similar to CCC.
