NMNEC LPN HS Curriculum	Terri Tewart prepared her curriculum for presentation to the SFCC curriculum committee, but due to personal circumstances she was unable to attend the curriculum committee meeting. She will present the proposed NMNEC HS LPN curriculum in the fall at the first SFCC curriculum committee meeting.	
NMNEC LPN College Curriculum	<p>Sabrina spoke with Misty and confirmed that her LPN students did not step-out. They were LPN students on a certificate track.</p> <p>Several schools have expressed an interest in an LPN track that matches the ADN curriculum through Level 3. Several concerns were expressed by members. If students complete the same prerequisites as the ADN students and then take the same courses through level III, they would only need one more semester to finish their ADN. An LPN track using this curriculum does not seem to be in the best interest of the student. How would HLC view the curriculum? There would be at least 60 credits in an LPN program with this design which would exceed the recommended number of credits for a certificate.</p> <p>The LPN taskforce members recommended that colleges could consider the NMNEC high school curriculum, but that they would not recommend designing an additional LPN curriculum for colleges using the existing curriculum for ADN programs.</p>
