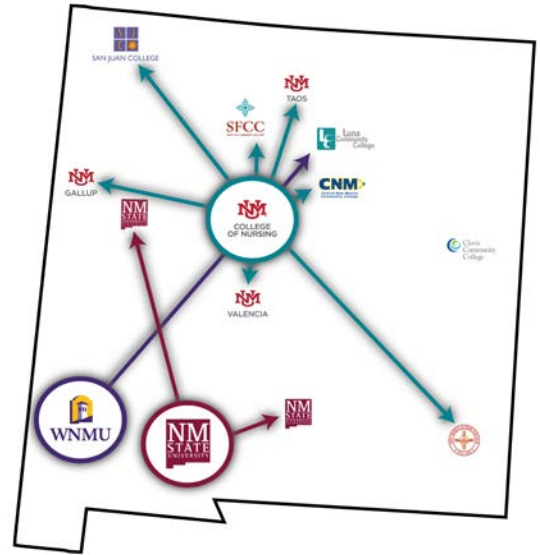
Statewide Collaboration

The New Mexico Nursing Education Consortium (NMNEC/nem-nek) was developed in 2009 as a collaborative of *every* state-funded nursing program across the state. The Consortium has brought stability and quality to the nursing workforce supply through:

1. Implementation of a statewide common pre-licensure nursing curriculum
2. Building nursing education partnerships between universities and community colleges
3. Developing multiple coordinated pathways into nursing education

Common Statewide Curriculum

Participating NMNEC nursing programs are all teaching the "NMNEC Common Curriculum." This is a concept-based curriculum producing nurses who are patient-centered, who think critically, and are able to recognize the needs of patients. A conceptually-based curriculum promotes students' understanding and application of health/illness and professional nursing concepts in the provision of nursing care.



Opportunities/Outcomes

- Access and opportunity to enroll in a pre-licensure ADN or BSN program is available in all four quadrants of the state
- Students who receive their nursing degree "close to home" most often secure employment in their home communities
- Significant tuition savings (average of 50%) for Dual Degree students receiving their BSN education at a community college in partnership with a university
- Employers have a great sense of the preparation of NMNEC graduates throughout the state
