

# **FREE SBIRT NMNEC Faculty Training and Consultation on the *Implementation of the SBIRT Nursing Curriculum***

The NMNEC November Statewide Meeting included a workshop titled, “*The SBIRT Tool: How do we incorporate this in the Classroom?*” presented by the RUHPS-SBIRT training grant team from UNM. We also heard from UNM College of Nursing faculty who have implemented this into their courses as part of this grant project.

## **NMNEC Faculty Training and Consultation:**

RUHPS-SBIRT Grant Team will provide:

- Free training on implementing the SBIRT Nursing Curriculum to include:
- Lesson plan for each class at each level
- PowerPoint for each class at each level
- All training tools/resource, online programs, BNI videos
- Motivational Interviewing: Helping People Change, 3<sup>rd</sup> Edition (Applications of Motivational Interviewing) by William R. Miller and Stephen Rollnick
- Three 3-hour consultations to assist with curriculum implementation in your program (before July 2019)

Faculty Participants in Training and Consultation Receive:

- \$200 stipend for up to 2 faculty from each NMNEC program to help with the cost of traveling to Albuquerque. Although more than 2 faculty from each NMNEC program are welcome to attend the training, please work with your respective nursing directors to confirm your participation and determine who should receive the stipend.
- Free Curriculum to use, to adjust, and implement how they see best; focus on how to easily implement with online materials and PowerPoint slides
- Thumb-drive of all lesson plans, slides, book on MI-3<sup>rd</sup> edition-
