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Introduction:

- Common statewide pre-licensure nursing curriculum
- 12 universities/community colleges
 - BSN offered in 14 locations
 - ADN offered in 9 locations

Methods:


- Concept-based curriculum
- ADN is a sub-set of the BSN
- University/Community College Partnerships
- LPN pathway entering term 2
- RN-to-BSN pathway with no repeat coursework

Results:

- Statewide resource efficiency
- Statewide faculty development & resource sharing
- Increased access for students
 - 12 rural locations
- Exceptional pass-rates
- New Mexico legislative funding

Future:

- 2-4 additional nursing programs
- Increase seats
- Build nursing workforce in NM



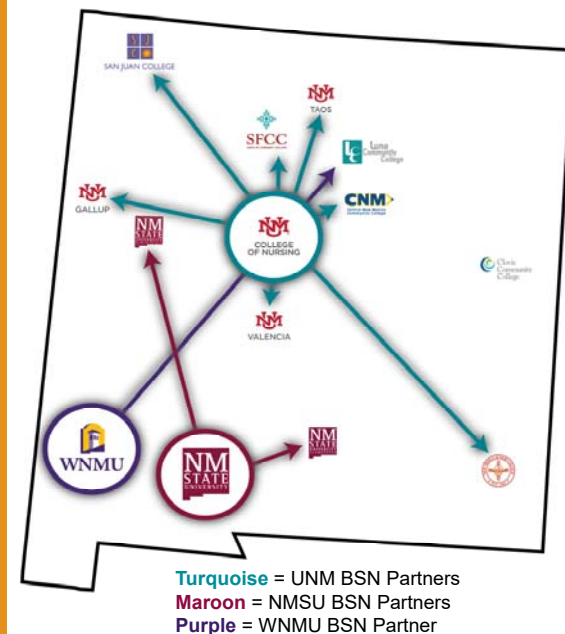
