To access the easier-to-find NMNEC curriculum documents in the faculty login area, current users will need reset their passwords. <u>These procedures</u> can be used as a reference.



### **Current Openings**

#### NMNEC Leadership Council ADN Program Member

The New Mexico Nursing Education Consortium is guided by the NMNEC Leadership Council and Each Leadership Council representative agrees to serve a minimum of two (2) years.

The functions of the Leadership Council are to manage operations for the Consortium, including:

- Oversee the work of the established NMNEC Committees
- Create and oversee the work of ad-hoc committees and projects
- Plan general meetings
- Secure and manage resources
- Manage communications between NMNEC membership and other individuals/organizations
- Ensure accountability for deadlines/goals
- Act as a liaison to government organizations and task forces
- Bring major policy decisions to membership for discussion and voting

#### **Election Process & Timeline:**

- Nominations will be accepted from July 6, 2020 July 17, 2020
- Nominees will receive an email request after July 17, 2020 to submit a headshot and a video presentation.
- The headshot and video will be sent along with answers on the nomination form to the NMNEC Curriculum Member Programs by July 27, 2020.
- Voting will take place via SurveyMonkey from July 27 August 6, 2020.
- Election results will be announced via email after August 10, 2020.
