#### **NMNEC Accreditation Committee**

This stand-alone committee will be housed under the NMNEC Leadership Council and has been established to help NMNEC Curriculum Programs develop and maintain a substantive change template that can be used by all NMNEC programs, streamlining processes for AACN and CCNE accreditation and self-studies.

Using a shared file on the secure NMNEC website, the committee can utilize and update accreditation documents throughout the year and as needed, so that NMNEC Curriculum Programs are able to select sections from these available resources and easily insert them into respective self-studies.

As programs near or complete accreditation, directors and faculty from all twelve NMNEC Curriculum Programs can rotate positions on the committee to receive and provide guidance with approaching accreditation cycles.

#### NMNEC FY21-22 RPSP Goals

NMNEC has made a commitment to meet State goals/expectations for continued funding.

- Goal 1: Evaluate clinical placements/sites used by NMNEC programs
- Goal 2: Investigate student success models for prenursing students to address academic preparedness
- Goal 3: Develop common, statewide pathways to other levels of nursing

To meet this expectation, a \$10,000 project stipend will be provided to the twelve NMNEC curriculum schools, which can be used towards these initiatives.

- NMNEC curriculum program directors should submit their Project Opportunity Stipend application to <a href="mailto:nmnec@salud.unm.edu">nmnec@salud.unm.edu</a> by January 15, 2021
- NMNEC will review applications and disburse funding between January-March 2021
- Project leads will submit quarterly progress reports
- Completed projects due June 30, 2022

### NMNEC Program Evaluation Student Survey - Due at end of Fall 2020 semester/term

#### Addendum for 2020

Because of the changes to on-line learning that occurred during 2020, a couple of additional questions specific to obtaining student feedback about 2020 have been added. When students complete the standard survey, they will be automatically linked to the additional survey questions.

#### New Exit Questions Added for Graduating L4 and L5 Students

Three brief questions have been added to the exit questions for graduating ADN (L4) and BSN (L5) students to obtain information about intent to practice in New Mexico, intent to practice in a rural area, and intent to obtain higher nursing degrees.

Note: All students in all programs complete the **one** survey specific for the level just being completed. Student feedback is anonymous. Students only identify what type of student (ADN, BSN, or co-enrolled ADN/BSN) and school within each survey. The school identifier is removed when data is aggregated by NMNEC for NMNEC program evaluation purposes.

Schools do have the option to use the data from these surveys for their own program evaluation efforts and if a school or program wishes to access their school specific data, the Program Director requests access by emailing NMNEC at <a href="mailto:nmnec@salud.unm.edu">nmnec@salud.unm.edu</a>
