Greetings to all NMNEC faculty and to all those who support the NMNEC faculty and students!




The 2024 Spring semester is/has ended, and students have graduated.

Updated L1, L2, & L3 NMNEC Concept are Available for NMNEC Faculty

2024 Updated NMNEC Concepts

These concepts were updated and then peer-reviewed and approved by NMNEC Curriculum Committee in the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 academic years.

These updated concepts were approved by Leadership Council in February & April 2024.

2024 Updated NMNEC Concepts Edits/Changes Summarized

	Previous definition: Factors that affect the regulation of pH and conditions that contribute to imbalances.
	Updated definition: To maintain homeostasis, the human body employs many physiological adaptations. One of
	these is maintaining an acid-base balance. In the absence of pathological states, the pH of the human body ranges
	between 7.35 to 7.45, with the average at 7.40. Acid base balance is a dynamic interplay between three processes:
	acid production or intake, acid buffering and acid excretion.

	Previous definition: An immunological defense against tissue injury, infection, or allergy." (Sabo, 2017, p.230) It is a
	non-specific by complex response to what the body perceives as harmful.
	Updated definition: The inflammatory response is the body's way to repair and heal cell injury. This response
	depends on many variables including extent of injury and a patient's disease history (Harding., 2023).


New Mexico Board of Nursing (NMBON)
